- An intensive focus on the Structured Initial Interviews (SII) as both assessment and dynamic intervention with couples.
- The viewing, on video, of a Structured Initial Interview as well as class time practice using the SII.

A Training and Certificate Program of The Hiebert Institute

A New Program at The Hiebert Institute

For many business and non-profit executives, coaching has become a vital tool in achieving personal and organizational excellence. Just as in any sport or art medium, a skilled companion can help us refine our abilities, competency, and take us further than we could go on our own.

After decades of educating and mentoring marriage and family therapists, The Hiebert Institute is pleased to announce a new training and certificate program to credential qualified persons as a Master Coach.

Coaching at The Hiebert Institute

The Hiebert Institute approaches the practice of coaching through the lenses of Systems Psychodynamics. This perspective is a unique paradigm that integrates individual psychodynamics, group relations theory, cognitive psychotherapy, and open systems theory. The significant outcomes include increased resiliency, increased risk tolerance, and increased hardiness with a focus of “insight to action.”

Program Design

The Master Coach training program is a 16-month curriculum, including 14 workshops and 16 individual coaching sessions. The program requires that participants either have completed the Leadership Development Institute or be concurrently enrolled in the LDI. No exceptions can be made. (The LDI workshops are included in the 14 total workshops needed to complete the Master Coach certificate.)

Program Calendar & Costs

In addition to the 2010 LDI listed on the web site, www.mfcsaqc.org , under Latest Course Bulletins, the following dates are part of the Master Coach

Series: Master Coach 1: 9 April 2010, Master Coach 2: 3 June 2010, Master Coach 3: 4 June 2010, Master Coach 4: 8 October 2010, Master Coach 5: 18 February 2011 and Master Coach 6: 29 April 2011.

Tuition for the Master Coach Certificate program is \$3,600. A deposit of \$400 is due before January 31, 2010 and a tuition payment of \$200 is due at the end of every month until paid in full. Unfortunately, scholarships for the LDI program do not meet the criteria of the grantors for the Master Coach Certificate; however, additional arrangements can be made for those who face financial hardships.

Who May Apply for the Program

The Master Coach certificate is primarily designed for therapists or those trained in a cognate field of study. While a participant in the training program need not be a therapist, only those who have a solid working knowledge of psychodynamics will be admitted. Please note, in addition to the written application (see www.mfcsqc.org and click on Latest Course Bulletin), a telephone interview is required prior to admission; please email michael@central-ucc.org to arrange a time.

The Hiebert Institute and Degree Offerings

The Hiebert Institute at Marriage and Family Counseling Service established a P.R.I.M.E. relationship with the [Graduate Theological Foundation](#) (GTF) in 2003 to teach marriage and family theory and practice. The Hiebert Institute provides the curriculum for both the D. Min. and the Psy. D. Degrees that are awarded through the GTF. The D. Min, offers a concentration in marriage and family studies covering both theory and the history of marriage and family therapy. The Psy. D. course of study prepares the student to pass the national marriage and family therapy licensing examination and includes a practicum component.

Dr. Ball, who completed his doctorate in marriage and family therapy at Purdue University, is currently the President of the Illinois Association for Marriage and Family Therapy. He is a certified PREPARE and MBTI trainer.

William J. Hiebert, D. Min., is a Fellow and Approved Supervisor certified by the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy and a licensed marriage and family therapist. Dr. Hiebert was Adjunct Professor of Pastoral Counseling at the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary (1973-200) and is the co-author of Dynamic Assessment in Couple Therapy and Premarital/Remarital Counseling.

Shannon Michael Pater, Psy.D., the coordinator of the pastoral and executive excellence programs at the Hiebert Institute, completed graduate and doctoral studies focused on a development of a systems psychodynamic perspective, with an emphasis in pastoral psychotherapy (specializing in personality disorders), change & conflict management, and supervision & staff development.
